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INTERIM SFT PROCEDURES Community Risk Educator, Specialist and Officer

Procedure Title: Community Risk Officer Instructor
Effective Date: November 20, 2014
Section Change: Added Community Risk Educator, Community Risk Specialist, and Community Risk Officer courses to Instructor Registration.

New Instructors

New Instructors beginning to pursue instructor registration for the courses listed above should utilize the requirements listed on the subsequent interim procedure pages.

Justification: The State Board of Fire Services has approved the Community Risk Officer curriculum and associated educational requirements. These changes are directed at meeting the specific Job Performance Requirements established in NFPA standard 1035.

The current SFT Procedures Manual dated May 2008 does not include these new courses. This interim procedure clarifies the instructor registration requirements for Instructors seeking to teach the new course.

6.8.XX.3: Rank and Professional Experience

- A. A primary instructor for a CFSTES Community Risk Officer course shall meet the rank and professional experience qualifications listed below.
1. Performing in an “acting” capacity does not qualify.

CFSTES Courses	Rank and Experience
• *Community Risk Educator	• Have a minimum of one year experience in fire and life safety education within a Recognized Fire Agency in California
• *Community Risk Specialist	• Have a minimum of two years’ experience in fire and life safety education within a Recognized Fire Agency in California
• *Community Risk Officer	• Have a minimum of three years’ experience in fire and life safety education within a Recognized Fire Agency in California
