The California Building Standards Commission (CBSC) has announced that on August 2, 2004 they will accept proposed rulemaking by state agencies under their statutory authority to adopt and or amend building standards of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 24 that will be included in the "2004 Annual Code Cycle."

The SFM has in place an advisory board, the FLSAB that will meet to review and offer recommendations to the SFM's proposed rulemaking prior to CBSC's submission date.

Title 19-Public Safety, section 2.06; provides that whenever the SFM intends to adopt, amend or repeal a "building standard," the SFM shall present such proposal to the board for review and recommendation. The FLSAB may recommend an action to approve, disapprove or amend to any item that is noticed on the meeting agenda.

The SFM may accept, reject or modify, in whole or in part, the recommendation of the board provided that upon rejection or modification the SFM advises the board in writing as to the reasons for such rejection or modification. Following this meeting the SFM will provide to the public, the SFM's decisions regarding the FLSAB's recommendations.

The Following is a List of Subjects to Be Presented  
To the FLSAB for Their Review

**A. Review of the Proposed Adoptions and the Proposed Amendments to the 2001 California Building Code (CBC) & the 2001 California Fire Code (CFC)**

1. **Adopt by reference;** 2003 Uniform Mechanical Code with the amendments of the 2001 California Mechanical Code.
2. **Adopt by reference;** 2003 Uniform Plumbing Code with the amendments of the 2001 California Plumbing Code.
3. **Amendments addressing;** building requirements for buildings and or structures used for adult day programs and adult day health care centers for non-ambulatory. Additionally, should these programs elect to voluntarily install and use delayed egress devices and secured perimeter fencing in their programs. These facilities are required to follow the provisions of the 2001 CBC and 2001 CFC.
4. **Amendments addressing;** public school campus definition and fire-resistive substitution for new campus as shown in the 2001 CBC.
5. **Amendments addressing;** the repeal of Appendix Chapter 3A, Use or Occupancy for placement into the 2001 CBC, Chapter 3, Use or Occupancy as shown in the 2001 CBC.
6. **Amendments addressing;** the placement of Group R-6 Occupancies into table 3-A, Description of Occupancies By Group and Division as shown in the 2001 CBC.
7. **Amendments addressing;** the allowable building height and area for facilities such as halfway houses, community correctional centers, community treatment centers, etc. as shown in Table 5B Allowable Building Heights and Basic Allowable Floor Area For Buildings One Story in Height as shown in the 2001 CBC.
8. **Amendments addressing;** Appendix Chapter 3A, Use or Occupancy, Division II – Detention and Correctional Facilities, Section 323A – Definitions as shown in the 2001 CBC.
9. **Amendments addressing;** the repeal of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) referenced standards shown in Chapter 9, section

904.1.2 with the addition of a note directing the code user to Chapter 35 of the 2001 CBC and Article 91 of the 2001 CFC.

- 10. Amendments addressing;** corridors in Group I Occupancies, shown in section 1007.5.4, except that in hospitals and nursing homes classified as Group I, Divisions 1.2, 2 & 3 Occupancies, nurses' stations shall have a minimum of two interconnected smoke detectors. An external reference to the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 19 will be made in the 2001 CBC for additional requirements.
- 11. Amendments addressing;** the update of the referenced national standards as shown in Chapter 35 of the 2001 CBC. These updates include such items as current edition dates, new number assignments made by the national organization, etc.
  - 11.1 Amendments addressing;** the update of the referenced national standards as shown in Article 91 of the 2001 CFC. These updates include such items as current edition dates, new number assignments made by the national organization, etc.
- 12. Amendments addressing;** the protection of commercial cooking operations as shown in the 2001 California Fire Code, section 1005. Protection of commercial cooking equipment shall comply with the standards of Underwriters Lab (UL) 300.
