4. **Latest Report to the CBSC:**

The following text is excerpted from a report Chief Ruben Grijalva submitted to the Secretary and Commissioners of the California Building Standards Commission on March 14, 2006:

Activity in our code development efforts continues to be successful.

I am pleased to report that the management team, Core Group and Work Groups who have been working on this project are well on their way to developing the proposed amendments that will be presented to the California Building Standards Commission this May.

Over the past few months, fourteen Workgroups have spent hundreds of hours reviewing code provisions and developing a comprehensive package of recommendations. Each of these recommendations has been evaluated by the Core Group. A series of draft proposals has been posted on our website that provides details on these recommendations as the package is moved to its final form (February 1, 7, 14, 21, March 7). The Core Group recommendations will then be reviewed by senior SFM staff before I evaluate the proposals myself.

In addition to the activities of the Core Group and fourteen Workgroups, our office has held a series of public “Stakeholder” meetings. The first was held in Sacramento on January 20; the second was held in Irvine on February 22; the final meeting is scheduled for March 24 in San Jose. Input and recommendations obtained from Stakeholders will be integrated into our amendment proposal.

As promised, the process of evaluating the model codes and developing recommended amendments that we are using involves a tremendous amount public participation. We believe that the documents we will be presenting to the Commission in May will be based on the consensus of opinions from fire and building officials as well as other State Agencies, industry, product groups, and other stakeholders.
