EXPRESS TERMS

§ 1160.10. General.

(a) Examination Gowns and Sleepwear. Fabric or fabric-like material in examination gowns and sleepwear ~~shall be tested in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 4, Standard Number 702-1975 of the National Fire Protection Association and shall have an average time of burning of 8.0 seconds or more~~ shall meet the flammability standards adopted in Title 16, CFR, Chapter II, Subchapter D.

Exceptions:

~~(1) Smooth surfaced fabrics (without nap or pile) weighing 4.0 ounces per square yard or more. Weight shall be determined in accordance with ASTM D1910.~~

~~(2) Items need not be preconditioned as specified in Sections 3-2 and 4-1 of Standard 702 if they are intended to be used only once and discarded, not intended to be washed or laundered, and are labeled accordingly.~~

(b) Sheets and Pillowcases. Fabric or fabric-like material in sheets and pillowcases ~~shall have an average time of burning of 7.0 seconds or more when tested in the manner specified in this section~~ shall meet the flammability standards adopted in Title 16, CFR, Chapter II, Subchapter D.

Exceptions:

~~(1) Smooth surfaced fabrics (without nap or pile) weighing 3.2 ounces per square yard or more. Weight shall be determined in accordance with ASTM D1910.~~

~~(2) Items need not be preconditioned as specified in Sections 3-2 and 4-1 of Standard 702 if they are intended to be used only once and discarded, not intended to be washed or laundered, and are labeled accordingly.~~

(c) Sleepwear and Robes, Children's sleepwear and robes shall meet the flammability standards adopted in Title 16, CFR, Chapter II, Subchapter D. Adult clothing including robes shall meet the flammability standards adopted in Title 16, CFR, Chapter II, Subchapter D.
