- (B) CERTIFICATION ESTABLISHED
 - (3) Certification guidelines revised effective January 1, 2002.
 - (b) Requirement for current Fire Code Inspector certification from the International Code Council (ICC) or National Code Services Association, Inc (NCSA) in the fire code adopted by the State of California added.
 - (D) CERTIFICATION GUIDELINES
 - (2) Prerequisites
 - (d) Current Fire Code Inspector certification from the International Code Council (ICC) of National Code Services Association, Inc (NCSA) in the fire code adopted by the State of California.
 - (G) MAINTENANCE GUIDELINES
 - (1) After receiving certification you are responsible for maintaining your International Code Council (ICC) or National Code Services Association, Inc (NCSA) Fire Code Inspector certification.

Justification: In January 2009, The Uniform Fire Code Association became the National Code Services Association, Inc (NCSA). They continue to provide Fire Code Inspector certification and classes. Personnel are required to maintain their NCSA or ICC certification to maintain their level of fire prevention certification.

This procedure clarifies requirements to become certified in Plans Examiner or Fire Marshal.
